

Maths

- Collect some small objects (maybe toys or leaves/pebbles collected from outside) and carefully count out how many you have. Can you find 1 more? Continue to 20. Can you now count your objects backwards? Gather more objects- which amount has more or less?



- Hide a piece of 'buried treasure' (maybe a toy) for your grown up. Can you direct them to the treasure using your mathematical language? For example: forwards, backwards, left, right, half turn etc. You may even want to draw a treasure map to help you!

Understanding the World

- Pirates sail everywhere! Use a map of the UK or a world map and ask your grown up to label where you have been. Can you then explain whether that place is in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland?



- We are learning to name common plants and trees. Can you go on a nature walk and spot any plants or trees and learn their name? Can you find things like nettles (don't touch them though!), dandelions, poppies, roses, daisies etc?

Let's Get Active!

- This term we are developing our locomotion skills such as skipping, running and jumping. You could take a photo or draw a picture of you practising the different activities:
 - Frogs or Rabbits- Play with a grown up. When your grownup shouts 'frogs' you will try and jump as far as you can. When they shout 'rabbits', you will try to jump as high as you can.
 - Collect the Coins- Make some pretend pirate coins with numbers 1-10 written on them. Spread out the coins and use different objects as obstacles eg. Pillows, soft toys. Next, run or skip around the obstacle course, trying to collect the numbered coins in the correct order.
- If you like, you could come up with your own activity.
