Parents' Curriculum Information

Phase 2 (Year 2)



English



This term our topics are 'Kings and Queens' and 'Where does this plant grow?' In English, we will be continuing to develop our spelling, punctuation (? ! and using a , in a list) and grammar and applying this in our extended writing. We will be practising different spelling rules, using different word types and developing a range of grammatical skills. In our whole class reading sessions, we will be enjoying a range of fairy tales and learning about the different features. We are also looking forward to reading 'The Giraffe, Pelly and Me'. Throughout the term, please continue to practise developing your reading fluency and comprehension at home, as well as learning the different spelling rules.

Maths

We will continue to build on our maths learning by practising our times tables, adding and subtracting numbers quickly and using our basic mental arithmetic. We will be learning the vocabulary for position and direction and we will also learn how to answer questions about tally charts and block diagrams in statistics.

To develop our problem solving skills, we will need to be using our maths knowledge to read word problems, decide what type of calculation needs to be used and what method we are going to use to solve the problem. These will include division and multiplication as well as addition and subtraction. Please help your child to write numbers as words and to spell them correctly.



Science, History and Geography



In science, we will be focusing on plants. We will understand what a plant is and how it survives. We will work scientifically to plan and carry out an experiment to understand if all plants need water and light to survive.

In history, we will be using a range of historical sources to learn about the monarchy and learn some facts about King Henry VIII.

In Geography, we will learn about continents and oceans and complete a country study, comparing the UK and Kenya.



Computing and Online Safety



In our computing sessions, we will be learning how to create a stop motion animation. We will be using the ipads to take individual pictures and then join them together to create the animation.

PSHE and RE



For our PSHE learning, our Jigsaw focus this term will be on 'Relationships' and 'Changing Me'. We will be talking about friendships, identifying things that can cause conflict and suggesting positive problem solving techniques to resolve these. We will also be learning about life cycles and recognising changes that we notice in ourselves and others.

In RE, the children will answer the big question – 'Can books and stories be good teachers?' In order to answer this, they will find out what Christians might learn from the parables of Jesus and why the Torah is such a joy for the Jewish community.

Physical Education



We are looking forward to our PE outside this term! In the first half term, we will be practising our defending and attacking skills in net and ball games. In athletics, we will be learning different field and running events. In the second half term, we will be using our simple skills of throwing, catching and co-ordination to improve our batting and fielding skills. We also look forward to our Forest Skills sessions! Both Year 2 classes will spend an afternoon or morning in the forest, in all weathers, developing many beneficial outdoor skills. Art, Music and Design and Technology



In DT, we will enjoy learning how to sew and join materials together to create a little pouch. In Art, the children will be using a variety of skills and mediums to create maps such as drawing, creating their own felt, using stain glass windows and printing. In Music this term, the children will be learning to play the recorder, including how to hold it correctly and positioning their fingers to create different rhythms and learning simple tunes.
